LEMAY/ PILOT CALLBACK SIDES

PILOT

We have a visual on Honshu, general. (Beat. No response.) General? (Beat.) General LeMay?

LEMAY

(looking up) I heard you the first time, captain.

PILOT

Yes, sir.

LEMAY

Bearing?

PILOT

Two o'clock, sir. You can just make out the coastal lights. There.

LEMAY

(squinting through the canopy) I'll take your word for it. Damnedest night I've ever seen. Black as a bucket of tar. Black as Stalin's heart.

PILOT

Yes, sir. Spooky.

LEMAY

I don't believe in spooks. Just the mission.

PILOT

Yes, sir.

LEMAY

Tokyo?

PILOT

The glow in the distance, sir. There.

LEMAY

You kids and your eagle eyes. Night runs are a young man's game. Always will be.

PILOT

I'm sure your eyes are fine, sir.

LEMAY

You don't have to kiss my ass. I picked you myself. E.T.A.?

PILOT

2300 local time, sir. As you calculated. And thank you. I'm honored.

LEMAY

A lot of people will die tonight. There's no honor in that. It's just a job. That's all we're doing.

PILOT

Of course. Sir.

LEMAY

I'm glad you agree. Now take us down.

PILOT

Sir?

LEMAY

I need to eyeball this thing, and I can't do that from 50,000 feet. So we're going to make a dry run. Maintain your heading and take us over ground zero. Level off at 5,000 feet.

PILOT

Sir, our flight plan takes up over the Boso Peninsula. At that altitude -

T.F.MAY

I wrote the flight plan, captain.

PILOT

But ... we'll be vulnerable to anti-aircraft -

LEMAY

We call it combat.

PILOT

I know what it's called, SIR. We have a thermo -- (He clears his throat.)... a hot payload. My orders are to safeguard -

LEMAY

Your orders, NOW, are to descend to 5,000 feet. Or do I have to take this down myself?
